Understanding Personal Curriculum for Special Education Students

- What is a Personal Curriculum
 - Provides an alternative pathway for GE and Special Education students.
- o Who can request?
 - Parent or Guardian
 - Students eighteen or over
 - School Personnel
- O Who Qualifies?
 - Students with IEPs
 - GE students who seek modifications
 - Students seeking advanced coursework.
 - Transfer students needing graduation requirement adjustments.
- Many members are required for a Personal Curriculum
 - Please see slide for further breakdown of members needed.
- o What are the roles and responsibilities of staff?
 - GE teachers- provide input on curriculum.
 - Special Ed teachers- advocate for students with IEPS
 - Counselors & administrators- Oversee the process.
 - Parents & Students- Actively participate in decision-making and goal setting.

- Important Information to consider from IEPS.

- o What is EDP?
 - Educational Development Plan (EDP) looks at career exploration. Developed when students are in the seventh grade with the support of school personnel.

- Addresses students' strengths.
- Parents input.
- Looking at career clusters
- Helps students plan for their future.
- Important aspects of transition planning
 - Documentation
 - EDPs
 - Data
 - Assessment Results
 - Ongoing
- The Process
 - Identify the need.
 - Submitting a request
 - Developing a plan
 - Gaining approvals
 - Monitoring progress
- When NOT to do a PC (Personal Curriculum)
 - If students can meet Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) with support
 - If the request is only about convenience
 - If the need is short-term
 - If it lowers expectations too far
 - If the IEP already addresses the issue
 - If parents or staff are unclear on goals
- Remember alternate pathways!
 - CTE programs
 - Many are opening Livonia, Wayne Westland, etc.
 - You can take a program that absorbs you of other requirements in the MMC curriculum.
 - Many high schools have different classes that count towards the MMC requirements.
- Unintended Consequences to a PC
 - Admission/preparedness to specific colleges
 - Eligibility for NCAA athletic programs
 - Admission to some trade schools
