## What is the School-based Services Program?

The School-based Services Program (SSP) is designed to assure that ALL Medicaid-eligible students have access to healthcare services within the school setting; and that schools providing these services receive support through Medicaid funding.

## What type of services does the School-based Services Program cover?

- Physical Therapy
- Speech & Language
- Orientation & Mobility

## Is this a new program?

**No**—Michigan schools have been participating in this program since 1993.

## Is there a cost to me?

**No** – IEP/IFSP, 504 and Plan of Care services are provided to students while they are at school at NO cost to the parent/guardian.

## Will it impact my family's Medicaid benefits?

**No** -The School-Based Services program does NOT impact a family's Medicaid services, funds, or limits. Michigan operates the School-Based Services program differently than the Family Medicaid program. The School-Based Services program does not affect your family's Medicaid benefits in any way.

## How can I assure my child's school receives benefits from the School-based Services Program?

Federal regulations require the parent/guardian:

- To be fully informed about the School-based Services program.
- To provide consent to release school records containing the student's information to Michigan Medicaid and billing agencies for the purpose of participating in the School-Based Services program. This information may include: student name, address, date of birth, student ID, Medicaid ID, disability, service dates, and the type of service rendered.
- To understand that consent is voluntary and can be withdrawn at any time.

You can help by providing your written consent, which allows your school district to continue to participate in the School-Based Services program. In the times of reduced state funding for schools, all reimbursements are extremely important. Written consent forms are provided by your child's SSP provider. Please confirm with them that your consent is on file.
