G. President's Remark and Board Comments

Member Blackmon shared SEMCOG updates including upcoming elections for the executive board. Member Blackmon submitted interest to be re-elected.

Member Beri congratulated Board Secretary Mary Blackmon on her Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) President's Award.

Member Funderburg provided an update from the State of the County presented by Wayne County Executive Warren Evans, attended by Members Blackmon and Funderburg and RESA Superintendent, Dr. Daveda Colbert. Significant accomplishments were shared and unsung heroes in the county were recognized, along with RESA being acknowledged for the partnership with the County Executive's Office. Member Funderburg thanked Dr. Colbert for the invite and the work she and Wayne RESA is doing with Wayne County Executive Warren Evans on behalf of Wayne County students.

Member Funderburg also shared her appreciation for the opportunity to witness the camaraderie among staff and the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion presentation that created safe spaces for everyone during the virtual All Staff Meeting on March 1.

Member Petrie provided an update from the Michigan Association of Computer Users in Learning (MACUL) Conference held March 13-15, 2024. I. Special Presentations

- 1. Using Data to Align Strategy Informed Practice that Contributes to Workforce Development and Sustainability Paul Carlin and Lisa Sadikot, Career Counselors and Krista McKinney-King, Director of Workforce Development, CTE, Adult Ed and Career Counseling provided an update on post-secondary goals, Career Technical Education (CTE) and Adult Education. The redesign of the Workforce Development Website was presented to the Board. Member Funderburg was acknowledged for her work with SEMCA and assistance with programming, and thanks was extended to Jordan Ewert, Website & Graphic Design Coordinator, for his impressive work on the website re-design.
- 2. Enhancing Professional Learning Accessibility: Creating Asynchronous Opportunities Update Matt Smoot, Learning, Innovation, and Technology Consultant, Michelle Wagner, Manager and Mari Treece, Executive Director shared information and examples of asynchronous and synchronous professional learning opportunities.

J. Superintendent's Report

Executive Director of Legislative Affairs Mike Latvis

Mr. Latvis shared the following legislative updates:

- The Dyslexia bills are moving forward with a House Education Committee hearing in April.
- The House Committee took testimony on the School Safety Bills on March 19.
- Bill 285, making kindergarten mandatory, passed out of the Senate, and will be presented to the House in the spring.
- Ideas shared by legislators include a one-hour ninth grade seminar in organ tissue donation, and a water safety awareness curriculum.

- A bill regarding AED Defibrillator machines passed out of the House to require schools to and be trained in machines. Concerns have been raised regarding the definition of irregular heartbeat.
- Senator Camilleri presented a bill that every school building has a library with a certified librarian. No hearing has been scheduled.
- The Senate budget is expected the week of April 9 or 16 and the House budget is expected the end of April.

Deputy Superintendent of Educational Services, Beth Gonzalez

Ms. Gonzalez shared the following updates:

- Solar eclipse glasses were provided to the Board. The very rare and very historical total solar eclipse will be April 8, 2024. 70,000 glasses were provided to Wayne County students.
- As a continuation of RESA's work around AI (Artificial Intelligence), an AI Summit targeting secondary educators will be held in the Fall (November 7, 2024).
- RESA is working hard to support new grants and working with districts for application. The grants.resa.net site created as a grant resource hub to provide detail and support has been shared throughout the state. Positive feedback has been received regarding the comprehensive template being essential in districts ability to apply.

Deputy Superintendent of Administrative Services, Kelly Bohl

Ms. Bohl shared the following updates:

- Thanks to the Board for taking the time to review the changes to policies and administrative regulations being presented for approval.
- An action item for the appointment of Stephenie O'Callaghan to Supervisor of Financial Services is being presented to the Board. Stephenie O'Callaghan has been serving in the role of Accounting Supervisor since June 19, 2022. Ms. O'Callaghan has supervisory responsibility in this role. As part of a minor restructuring of the Financial Services Department, it is recommended that Ms. O'Callaghan be placed into a non-bargaining position.
- As a point of pride, it was shared that 33% of RESA staff is serving in a role different from the role they hired into. Four new administrative assistants were introduced to the Board during the March meeting and majority of those vacancies were created by individuals who have moved to other internal opportunities.

Assistant Superintendent of Financial Services, Drew McMechan

Mr. McMechan provided an update on the upcoming budget process. The Preliminary 2024-25 Wayne RESA Budget will be presented to the Board in April, a budget hearing will be held in May and districts will be invited to attend. The formal budget hearing for adoption will be held in June.

1. Superintendent's Evaluation and Contract Extension
