<ul> <li>Complete FAFSA Application for participating programs: The application becomes available October 1.</li> <li>May 1 is the deadline for most State of Michigan funding options.</li> <li>a. Ensure student and parent/guardian portions are completed. Ensure electronic signatures have been completed by both student and parent/guardian. If you need assistance, please contact your school counselor and/or college's Financial Aid Office for help.</li> <li>b. For more information, visit <u>www.studentaid.gov</u></li> </ul>
Submit documentation to support FAFSA: ASAP after completion of FAFSA to ensure funding
Check with the school's Financial Aid office to inquire about required documentation. Sometimes this information can be found in your online account (college).
<b>Check with Michigan Student Aid Scholarships and Grants</b> (MISSG): You may be eligible for TIP funding. These are additional funds to assist with tuition costs. You may qualify if you are a current or past Medicaid recipient. There is no grade point average requirement. The deadline is August 31 after graduation. Check online or call 1 (888) 447-2687. <ul> <li>Locate ACT WorkKeys scores if required. Check with your School Counselor for more details.</li> <li>Applied Math</li> <li>Graphic Literacy</li> <li>Workplace Documents</li> </ul>

**Complete Placement Testing at the Community College.** You may be able to submit SAT scores in lieu of placement tests. Check with the admissions office or review information online. Many schools will allow you to walk-in and take placement tests. Please call or check the school's website for hours.

Attend Orientation: Online or in person, spring or summer. Check your online account for additional information.

**Submit Final Transcript in June after graduation requirements have been completed.** Submit this request through <u>www.parchment.com</u>

Meet with an academic advisor and register for classes
