## **WHO QUALIFIES?**

If your family lives in any of the following situations:

- In a shelter
- ► In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation
- In a car, park, abandoned building, or a bus or train station
- ► Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.
