## Questions & Answers

### Q: What does this catalog cover?

The catalog contains a comprehensive listing of professional development events sponsored by Wayne RESA for K-12 educators and support teams. It is published each year in April for the following year.

### Q: Who may participate in these professional development activities?

Events are designed for the broadest possible Wayne County audiences. Each course description specifies its target audience. Courses for non-instructional personnel are offered when possible and open only to those unique audiences identified.

### Q: Can I receive SCECHs?

State Continuing Education Clock Hours (SCECH) are hours earned by attending professional development activities provided by SCECH Sponsors and approved by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE). These hours can be used for renewal and progression of certificates and licenses issued by MDE. SCECHs are offered for many courses; they are marked with a clock icon (see key above).

### Q: Do I have to attend all days of the event?

To get the most out of each learning opportunity, you are encouraged to attend an entire event. If you register for college credit or SCECHs, you must attend all days, arrive on time, and stay until the end of each day. If you are seeking professional development hours to meet state requirements, you will only receive credit for the hours that you attend. Reimbursement is not granted for partial attendance.

### Q: How do I register for my courses?

It is important to pre-register for sessions at least two weeks in advance. Space cannot be guaranteed for walk-in registrants. Registration will not be confirmed without accompanying payment. Courses that do not meet minimum enrollment requirements may be canceled and those enrolled will be notified. The original meaning of “assess” was to “sit beside.” In this spirit, the Responsive Assessment Network will continue to support teachers, coaches, curriculum directors, and other school leaders in expanding humanizing, responsive, and restorative assessment practices that support students’ academic needs, social-emotional health, and growing sense of autonomy and agency. ## EDUCATOR EVALUATION 2024-25

**Senate Bills 395-396 brings changes to the Educator Evaluation system for the 2024-25 school year.**

### Key Changes, effective July 1, 2024:

- New Ratings: Effective, Developing and Needing Support
- Remove punitive aspects of evaluations: focus on improvement and professional development
- Removal of the requirement that evaluations must be done “at least annually”
- At least 15 minute observations, twice a year (written feedback is required within 30 days)
- 20% of the year-end evaluation must be based on student growth and assessment data or student learning objectives metrics & 80% based on the Observation Tool
- The use of State data as a requirement in the growth component has been removed. The growth component will consist of 20% local data, that will be agreed upon by the district.
- Requirement for the use of three years of data is removed
- Still required to use a state approved Observation Tool, but may use a local tool if meets requirements
- Teacher Evaluations: Danielson, 5D, Thoughtful Classroom, and Marzano
- Administrator Evaluations: School Advance and Multidimensional Leadership Performance System
- All evaluators must complete inter-rater reliability training by September 1, 2024 and then every three years thereafter

With the changes in Educator Evaluation, the State is requiring a Calibration Inter-rater Reliability Refresher training by September 1, 2024. The full Inter-rater Reliability Certification course is offered by some vendors, if bargained in a district, but not required.

Any Inter-rater Reliability training that included the components described in the new law would satisfy the training requirements and districts would not need to provide an updated training prior to September 1, 2024 **provided the prior training has occurred within the past three years.**

The law does not require districts to report to MDE the completion of the required rater reliability training. However, districts are encouraged to maintain documentation meeting this requirement along with evidence of compliance with all aspects of the evaluation law in case of future audits.

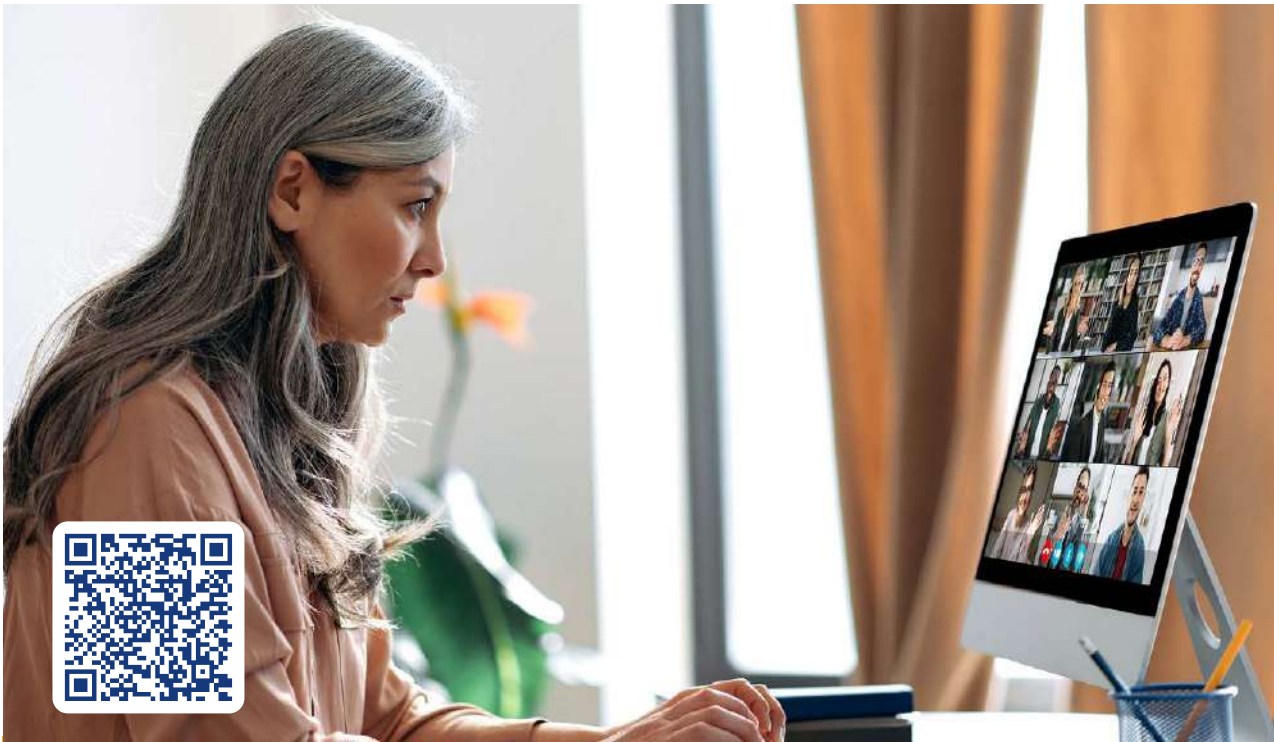

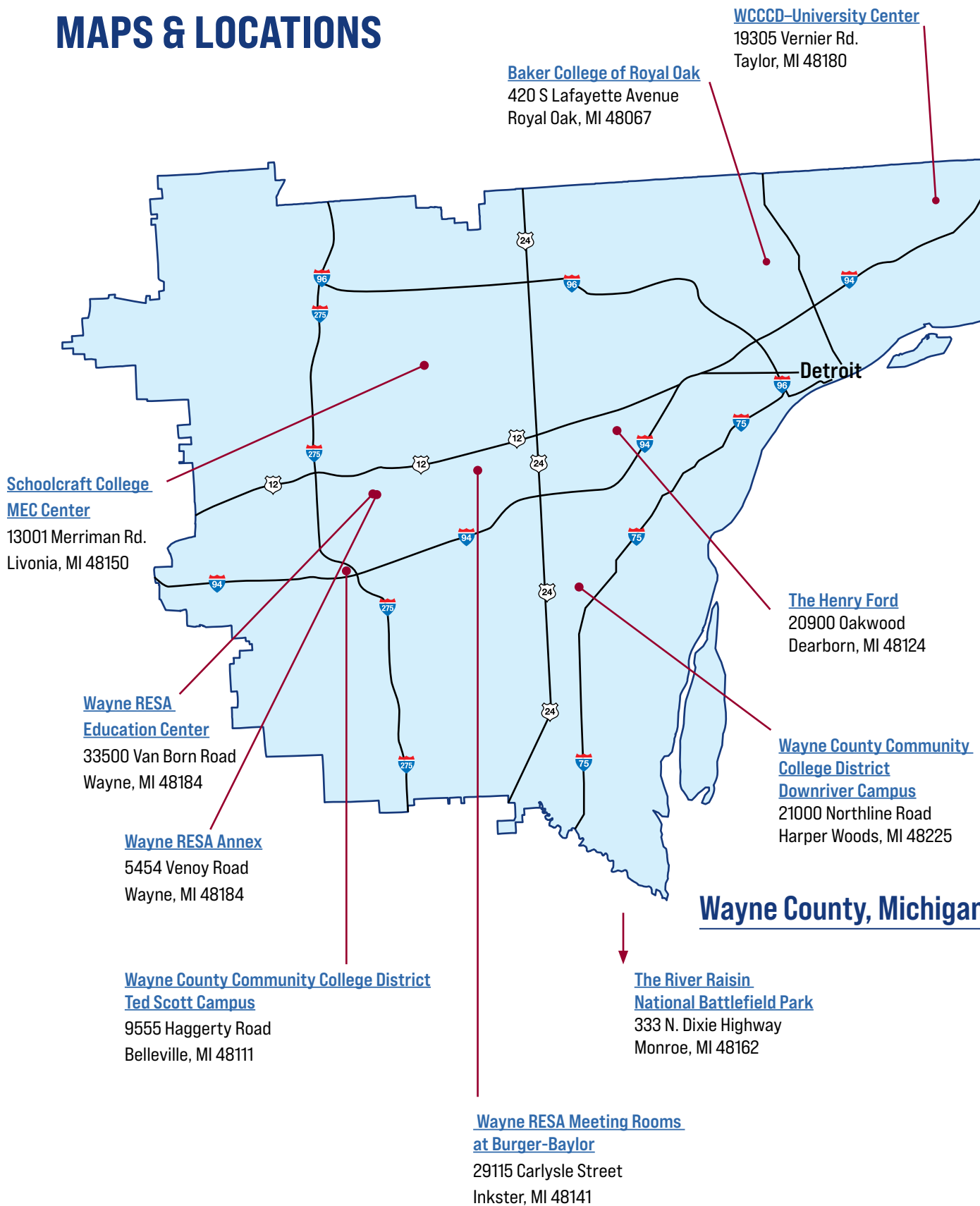
