



What We Have Done So Far....


- + Began a sytematic approach to reviewing LEA/PSA data relative to special education performance indicators
- + Began identifying a process of prioritizing districts by level of need using the quadrant approach
- + Identified a need for generic special education policies and procedures
- + Agreed to be part of Cohort 0
- + Consistently communicated with Special Education Administrators





- + Wayne RESA is charged with providing evidence of the support to local districts based on that district's identified quadrant.
- + MDE holding Wayne RESA accountable for local district data and will determine a county quadrant.
- + MDE holding Wayne RESA accountable for documentation of the "3 circles"
